Kissing Boo-Boo's Making the pain go away

Scraped knees, hurt feelings, and copious tears are all part of childhood. But kids today also experience real emotional pain. When violence surrounds them, they worry whether or not they will be safe. In divorce, they suffer the most.

Still, comforting children is in many ways less complicated than comforting adults because young hearts haven't developed scar tissue. Real disappointments have been few. Jesus modeled what a parent's first response to children should be when He laid hands on them and prayed for them (Matthew 19:13). He showed us that nothing comforts like a loving touch—nothing matches the power of prayer. But the words we say do have power. Used properly, they reinforce the ideals we attempt to model.
