The following resolution was offered by Trustee Martin Hughes, who moved its adoption, seconded by Trustee Marvin Madore, to-wit: **BOND RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF TUPPER LAKE, FRANKLIN COUNTY, NEW YORK (THE "VILLAGE"), AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF UP TO \$225,000 IN SERIAL BONDS OF THE VILLAGE TO FINANCE THE COST OF THE EXPANSION, UPGRADE AND IMPROVEMENTS OF THE VILLAGE'S ELECTRIC SUBSTATION**

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (the "Board") of the Village of Tupper Lake (the "Village") is considering undertaking a project consisting of the expansion, upgrade and improvement of the Village's Interconnection Distribution Substation (the "Substation"), to include (i) the addition of revenue metering, insulation, surge arresters, switches, circuit breakers, (ii) the acquisition and installation of equipment, machinery and furnishings for the Substation, and (iii) other ancillary and appurtenant facilities, improvements and services for the Substation (collectively, the "Project"); and **WHEREAS**, the Board of Trustees of the Village, acting as lead agency under the State Environmental Quality Review Act and the regulations of the New York State

Department of Environmental Conservation adopted thereunder (collectively, "SEQRA"), by resolution adopted immediately prior to the adoption of this resolution, that the Project constitutes a "Type II" action within the meaning of SEQRA, and that it will not have a significant impact on the environment, and that no further actions or proceedings are required to be taken under SEQRA; and **WHEREAS**, the Board of Trustees of the Village, acting as lead agency under the State Environmental Quality Review Act and the regulations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation adopted thereunder (collectively, "SEQRA"), previously determined that the Project constitutes an "Type II" action within the meaning of SEQRA, and that no further action is required to be taken by the Village; and **WHEREAS**, the Board now wishes to appropriate funds for the Project and to authorize the issuance of the Village's serial bonds or bond anticipation notes to finance said appropriation;

NOW THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF TUPPER LAKE, FRANKLIN COUNTY, NEW YORK (the "Village") HEREBY RESOLVES (by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of such body), **AS FOLLOWS:** Section 1. The Village is hereby authorized to issue up to \$225,000 principal amount of serial bonds (including, without limitation, statutory installment bonds) pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (the Law) to finance the estimated cost of the Project.

Section 2. It is hereby determined that the maximum estimated cost of the aforementioned specific object or purpose is \$225,000, said amount is hereby appropriated therefore and the plan for the financing thereof shall consist of the issuance of up to \$225,000 in serial bonds of the Village authorized to be issued pursuant to Section 1 of this resolution or bond

anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such serial bonds. Section 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforementioned specific objects or purposes is thirty (30) years, pursuant to subdivision a.5 of Section 11 of the Law. Section 4. The final maturity of the bonds herein authorized to be issued shall not be in excess of five (5) years measured from the date of issuance of the first serial bond or bond anticipation note issued pursuant to Section 1 of this Resolution. Section 5. Current funds are not required to be provided prior to the issuance of the bonds authorized by this resolution or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation thereof, pursuant to Section 107.00(d)(9) of the Law.

Section 6. The temporary use of available funds of the Village, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were borrowed, raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Law, for the capital purposes described in Section 1 of this resolution. The Village shall reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by Section 1 of this resolution. This resolution shall constitute a declaration of official intent to reimburse the expenditures authorized by Section 1 hereof with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized herein, as required by United States Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Section 7. Each of the serial bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said serial bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the Village, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the real property within the Village without legal or constitutional

limitation as to rate or amount. The faith and credit of the Village are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal and interest on said serial bonds and bond anticipation notes and provisions shall be made annually in the budget of the Village (by appropriation for) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and bond anticipation notes to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 8. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law, pursuant to the provisions of Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals of said obligations and of Section 21.00, Section 50.00, Section 54.90, Sections 56.00 through 60.00 and Sections 62.10 and 63.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Board relative to authorizing serial bonds and bond anticipation notes and prescribing terms, form and contents as to the sale and issuance of bonds herein authorized, including without limitation the determination of whether to issue bonds having substantially level or declining debt service and all matters relating thereto, and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, are hereby delegated to the Treasurer of the Village, as the chief fiscal officer of the Village (the "Village Treasurer").

Section 9. The Village Treasurer is hereby further authorized to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to ensure the continued status of the interest on the bonds authorized by this resolution and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as excludable from gross income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the Code) and to designate the bonds authorized by this resolution and any

notes issued in anticipation thereof, if applicable, as Aqualified tax-exempt bonds in accordance with Section 265(b)(3)(B)(i) of the Code.

Section 10. The Village Treasurer is further authorized to enter into a continuing disclosure agreement for the benefit of the bonds or notes in compliance with the provisions of Rule 15c2-12, promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

Section 11. The intent of this resolution is to give the Village Treasurer sufficient authority to execute those applications, agreements and instruments, or to do any similar acts necessary to effect the issuance of the aforesaid serial bonds or bond anticipation notes without resorting to further action of this Board.

Section 12. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause a copy of this resolution to be published in full in *The Tupper Lake Free Press*, the official newspaper of the Village for such purpose, together

with a notice of the Village Clerk in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Law. Section 13. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be contested only if: (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the Village is not authorized to expend money; or (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication; or (c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.
